

## DID YOU KNOW

- *Primary Day includes non-partisan elections as well as Party races.*
- *To vote in a Party Primary you must be registered in that party.*
- *However, ALL voters may vote on the non-partisan contests.*
- *General Elections include constitutional amendments, in addition to partisan contests.*
- *Voters may bring notes (even a marked sample ballot) to the polls, for their personal use.*
- *If a ballot is spoiled, a voter may have up to 2 additional ballots.*
- *Polling places must remain open to accommodate all voters who are in line at 7:00 pm.*
- *A change of address from another county can no longer be made at the polls but can be made by phone to the SOE at anytime, including Election Day.*

### *2012 Election Ballot includes:*

- *U.S. President and VP*
- *U.S. Senator*
- *All 27 FL Congressional seats*
- *Entire FL state legislature*
- *County races*

## VOTER REGISTRATION

### TO VOTE YOU MUST BE

- At least 18 years old
- An American citizen
- A legal resident of Florida and of the county where you will vote

### WHERE TO OBTAIN APPLICATION

- Public Libraries
- Motor Vehicle license bureaus
- Armed Forces offices
- Supervisor of Elections (SOE)  
(in person, by mail, or print from website).

You will receive a Voter information card in the mail which lists your polling place and legislative districts. If not received or if it is inaccurate, call the SOE main office.

## VOTING PROCEDURE

- You must vote at the precinct where you live, unless you vote early.
- To receive your ballot, you must show a photo/signature ID, such as:
  - Florida Driver's License
  - Florida ID card
  - Student ID card
  - U.S. Passport
  - HOA (community) ID
  - Retirement Center ID
  - Military ID
  - Public Assistance ID
  - Picture Debit or Credit Card
- If your picture ID does not show a signature, an additional signature ID will be required.
- All registered voters are allowed to vote, even if they forget their ID. They will be given a PROVISIONAL ballot.

7:00 AM—7:00 PM

## VOTE BY MAIL and EARLY VOTING

**ALL voters are permitted to vote by mail. To receive the ballot you may:**

- Request on-line, at [www.pbcelections.org](http://www.pbcelections.org).
- Request it be mailed. (Call 561-656-6200)
- Visit a Supervisor of Elections office in person.

Request must be made by 5:00 PM on the Wed. before an election and your completed ballot must be received by 7:00 PM on Election day at the Supervisor's office.

All requests for a mail ballot made prior to the 2010 General Election have expired. Re-apply! New applications will be valid through 2014. Ballots are mailed 35 days prior to an election.

**All qualified voters are also permitted to vote early if they prefer.**

- Early voting begins 10 days before an election. See back page for dates.
- If you vote early, you may vote at any early voting site.

If you choose NOT to vote early, and prefer voting on election day, you must vote at the precinct where you live.
